Action Plans:

Religious Education Programs

Strategy 1.1: Increase involvement, visibility and continuity of Priests and/or Religious in our schools and Parishes.

- Continue to invite Priests and seminarians to visit Theology classes on a Monthly basis in order to have a presence with students, to get to know students, and to be available to answer questions.
- Invite retired and visiting Priests and Sisters to visit and meet with Cedar Catholic students.

Strategy 1.2: Continue to schedule and increase access to Mass, Retreats, Rally's, Eucharistic Adoration, Campus Ministry and Discipleship, and Community Service Programs.

Continue to have students attend Mass weekly and on Holy Days.

- Continue to have each class participate in an off-campus retreat each year that is run by a priest and Campus Ministry members.
- Continue to have students attend Mass weekly and on Holy Days.
- Connect with Newman Centers of local universities/colleges; FOCUS missionaries; other high school Catholic schools for CCHS high school students for retreats, etc.
- Continue to have each class attend first Friday Mass, spends their theology time at church for Eucharistic Adoration, and participates in Benediction.
- « Continue to coordinate a service day where students ring bells for the salvation army at various locations, students help decorate church, choir sings at nursing homes, etc.
- Continue to host the Large Youth rally every other year & ideas for mini-rallies and schedule and coordinate mini retreats in off years of the larger Rally. Sending students to our elementary schools to do religious activities with elementary kids.
- Continue to have each class go to Confession once a month - either during Theology class time or as a big group.

Strategy 1.3: Continue to explore and expand resources and materials used in Religious Education Classes.

- Continue to provide a Bible for students to use in and outside class.
- Continue to provide teachers the Hallow app for personal use and in their classroom.
- Coordinate with the Evangelism Institute (EI) to provide resources and professional development to meet the 26-hour Catholic Schools Archdiocese Program.

Strategy 1.4: Increase opportunities for parents to be more involved in their child's faith formation and increased Vocations.

- Continue recruiting parents, grandparents, and community volunteers and share their faith in Discipleship Groups.
- Invite parents to daily mass - use bulletins; send note at beginning of year Cedar Masses at 8am or 2:40; check Sycamore calendar
- Continue supporting CCHS staff that are parents/grandparents to invest in their child(ren)'s faith formation by being actively involved in church, school and activities by being teachers, support staff and coaches of various activities.
- Continue to focus prayers for Vocations in the classroom - Rosary for Vocations; use school chapel to offer adoration —and Invite FOCUS missionaries to share their journey of Faith to increase Vocations to the Priesthood or Religious life.

- **1.2** Each class attends first Friday Class, spends their theology time at church for Eucharistic Adoration, and participates in Benediction.
- **1.2** Mr. Bengston organizes a community service day where students ring bells for the salvation army at various locations, students help decorate church, choir sings at nursing homes, etc.
- **1.2** Each class goes to Confession once a month - either during Theology class time or as a big group; Youth rally every other year & ideas for mini-rat lies
- **1.3** Each student was given a New Testament and Old Testament Bible that they can use in and outside class.
- **1.3** Teachers are provided the Hallow app for personal use and in their classroom.
- **1.3** Cedar Catholic Jr.-Sr. High School participates in the EI Institute to complete 26-hour Catholic Schools Archdiocese Program.
- **1.4** Parents, grandparents, and community volunteers currently participate and share their faith in Discipleship Groups.
- **1.4** Parents, grandparents, and parishioners are teachers/leaders in Family Formation, Jesus Night, and Confirmation preparation classes.
- **1.4** Many of our CCHS staff are parents/grandparents are invested in their child(ren)'s faith formation by being actively involved in church, school and activities by having teachers, support staff and coaches at various activities.



Core and Elective Education Programs

- Align textbook selection and curricula to the Omaha Archdiocese Curriculum Standards.

- Continue offering student counseling on options for registration for classes both from guidance counselors and classroom teachers.
- Annually review elective course offerings.
- Post online to school site, access to *our* class/course offerings.
- Expand health programs to include education on the harmful effects of alcohol/drug use/vaping, etc...
- Research and review Ag. science curriculum as a possible option for a 3rd year of science requirement

Strategy 2.3: Promote and increase access and support for a competitive Visual and Performing Arts Curriculum, Schedule, and Extra-Curricular Programs.

- Continue to promote and supports our fine arts extracurricular activities of band, pep band, jazz band, chorus, swing choir, One Act, and junior high and high school speech.
- Create a One-Act(1st semester)/Speech Competition (2nd semester) class option for high school.
- Continue to schedule JH sports during 8th period to allow all students the opportunity to participate and limit conflicts with facility conflicts.
- Expand One-Act Play schedule to allow our students opportunity to compete prior to Conference/District/State Contests.

Strategy 2.4: Recruit, develop, and retain teachers and administrators with the credential s, endorsements, and certification in their assigned areas.

- Conduct comparability study and update negotiated agreement annually.
- Expand efforts to recruit, develop, and retain quality, endorsed teachers, administrators, and support staff.
- Expand efforts to recruit, develop, and retain quality para educators, substitute teachers, custodial and maintenance, bus drivers, technology and office support staff.
- Research possible options for incentives to support teachers/staff interested in professional development, certification, and/or endorsements.
- Conduct observations, supervision and evaluation designed to develop staff and promote professional development and retention of a quality staff.



COMPLETED ACTION STEP

January 1, 2026 Report

- 2.1 The English department has used the new, updated textbooks in a few of the classes and presently enjoy how the content is structured and assessed while implementing a level of faith within the English classroom
- 2.1 Preparation for the Archdiocese assessment will begin mid-February to early March for the eighth-graders and sophomores will include reading practice texts and answering multiple choice questions as well as grammar-based questions and rule review.
- 2.1 Students are in their second year of testing all students 7-12 in reading (STAR Test) to be able to track growth and reading levels. Prior, just the junior high students took the STAR reading and math tests.
- 2.1 Teachers met in November and went through STAR test scores from the last four years and discussed continuing reading goals.
- 2.2 Mr. Bengston met with students at the end of first semester to go through class options, college credit and class changes.
- 2.3 The speech team is looking forward to even more growth in numbers this year, as they had 16 members in 2025 and they envision 21 members for the 2026 season.
- 2.3 Landon Rutar and Isabel Rolfes were the Speech team's two state qualifiers in 2025 and both reached the finals, with Rolfes placing 6th and Rutar placing 3rd in their respective events. After a tough district, CCHS still produced several district finalists alongside Rutar and Rolfes: Ava Stewart and Breah Steffen. All these members return to the team this season.
- 2.3 Kindergarten and Preschool designed pillows for 7th and 8th grade sewing class to create in October.
- 2.3 Culinary class made 12 dozen cookies for NAPA grand opening in October.
- 2.3 Culinary class went on a field trip to Burbach Countryside Dairy in October.
- 2.3 Cross-curricular with sewing and art class. 7th graders will work together to design and create saint pillows for 2nd graders. They also will create an embroidered landscape for the Conference Art Show.
- 2.3 The Nebraska Arts Council is sponsoring professional poet coaching for our school's Poetry Out Loud finalist prior to state and national competitions.
- 2.4 A teacher will be finishing their masters degree in October 2026 to further their development as a Catholic school teacher.
- 2.1 Mr. Bengston met with teachers in December and went through past 3 years of ACT scores and Pre-ACT scores. Teachers looked at low scoring questions and strategized how to improve weak spots.
- 2.1 Science and Consumer science teachers are all on the third floor to be closer to the lab and to better collaborate with each other for science continuity.
- 2.2 Teachers will incorporate ACT questions in their bell ringers throughout the year.
- 2.4 Teachers had three days of professional development coming back from Christmas break.
- 2.4 Staff portal was created to help with teacher communication for observation scheduling.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic High School Choir has 63 students this year in Chorus.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic High School Choir led our Catholic Schools week mass at Holy Trinity Catholic church
- 2.3 Our High School Choir again led a restore night in January at Holy Trinity Catholic Church.
- 2.3 The High School Choir sang for the OACCW mass in early September. We were honored to have our picture taken with the Archbishop afterwards.
- 2.3 The high school choir was invited in November to sing for a Praise night on Feb. 15th at Saint Mary's in Wayne.
- 2.3 Several High School choir students tried out for All State Chorus in October.
- 2.3 Jayden Lordeman and Kyson Lammers received the honor of being chosen for the 2026 FFA State Convention Choir.
- 2.3 Ashlynn Dailey and Jayden Lordeman will represent Cedar Catholic at the Wayne State Honor Choir. Jayden will be a member of the Mixed chorus and Ashlynn will be a member of the Women's Chorus.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic Swing choir has 23 members this year and will be competing in the Northeast Jazz Festival in the 2nd Semester
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic Choir went Caroling on our service day to Avera Majestic Bluffs and Sacred Heart Monastery in Yankton
- 2.3 The marching band performed during the Homecoming parade.
- 2.3 The marching band performed at WSC Band Day, taking second place in their division.
- 2.3 The pep band performed for at least 8 varsity sporting events (Football, Volleyball, Basketball) where students earned service hours for their time.
- 2.3 During the CCHS Service Day, the junior high band performed Christmas music at 3 local assisted-living / nursing homes.
- 2.3 Brady Lange auditioned and was selected as an alternate to 8th Grade All-State Band.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte auditioned for and was selected for a second time to the Nebraska All-State Honor Band.



- 2.3 Donnie Schulte auditioned for and was selected to the Doane Festival of Winds, UNK Honor Band, USD Quad State Honor Band, Patriots of the Plains Honor Band, and the Wesleyan University Honor Band.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte and Levi Fiscus auditioned for and were selected to the WSC Festival of Honor Bands.
- 2.3 Seven high school band students were selected to the MSC Honor Band.

July 1, 2025 Report

- 2.1 New textbooks have been ordered through the textbook grant for grades 7-12 English Language Arts classes. In addition, the textbooks that were chosen not only meet the standards through the state of Nebraska, but each unit also ties back into Christianity, asking the students to relate the reading and writing assignments to their faith lives.
- 2.1 Miss Pfeifer included analysis of scripture and analysis of the "liturgical prayer" that was recited each day in her curriculum. Both of these activities not only utilized critical thinking and reading analysis practices that are within the standards, but also required the students to look within themselves for areas of growth in their faith lives.
- 2.2 Next year, the required Speech course (non-college credit) will include a unit that teaches students applicable ways to defend the faith in their day to day living.
- 2.2 The new textbooks for 7-12 literature are Christian based and connects each lesson to Christian and or Catholic faith.
- 2.3 Starting in the 2026 season, Miss Pfeifer will be the head coach of the Speech Team and Mrs. Kleinschmit will become her assistant coach. This transition is exciting, as Miss Pfeifer is in the high school building and sees the students every day. Mrs. Kleinschmit suggested and supported this switch wholeheartedly.
- 2.3 Both coaches are optimistic in the efforts to generate interest in joining the team after such a jump in involvement this season. (From 6 students in 2024 to 16 in 2025)
- 2.3 Miss Pfeifer is still highly interested in teaching the One-Act(1st Semester)/Speech Competition(2nd Semester) class option if/when the opportunity arises.
- 2.3 The junior high students that are not in band rotate between the following classes, art, food consumer science, music appreciation and life skills.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic High School Choir led a restore night in song in January. It was a very powerful and joyful experience for all who participated; Along with this we continued to lead masses in son during the 2nd semester.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic led our Catholic Schools week mass at Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Bow Valley Neb. the last week in January.
- 2.3 Our high school choir had several students audition for the Wayne State Honor Choir. Danielle Eickhoff represented us in Wayne for this choral experience.
- 2.3 Our high school choir had two seniors who were chosen for the Nebraska Wesleyan Honor Choir . Ben Kleinschmit represented us very well.
- 2.3 Jayden Lordemann represented the choir at the State FFA convention being a member of their distinguished chorus.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic Swing Choir participated in the Northeast Jazz Festival and received an excellent rating;
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic had several large groups perform in the NSAA District Music Contest held in Laurel Neb. this year.
- 2.3 JAZZ BAND; CONCERT BAND; GIRLS CHORUS; BOYS CHORUS; MIXED CHORUS; SWING CHOIR; and several solos and small groups performed as well.
- 2.3 The Cedar Catholic Choir took a trip to Minnesota. We sang the 7th inning stretch at Target field; we were able to sing in the sacred space at St. Mary's Basilica and we were able to watch a very talented group of high school students from the JEFFERSON Theatre Company perform the musical MAMMA MIA:
- 2.3 The Junior High band performed at WSC and at the WSC Middle School Music Festival earning an Excellent Rating.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte & Jeffrey Heine auditioned and were selected to the Pierce Honor Band.
- 2.3 The High School Concert Band & Jazz Band performed at the District Music Contest in Laurel earning a Superior Rating & Excellent Rating respectively.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte performed a clarinet solo at the District Music Contest in Laurel earning a Superior Rating.
- 2.3 The Holy Trinity 4th Grade students that were interested in joining the band program came to Cedar Catholic to try out instruments for next year with the assistance of a few Junior High students.
- 2.3 The combined Junior High & High School Band performed for Graduation.
- 2.3 The Junior High traveled to USD in Vermillion to tour the art exhibits and listen to a percussion performance at the Music Museum on campus.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte & Levi Fiscus auditioned for and were selected to the Class C All-State Honor Band.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte & Levi Fiscus auditioned for and were selected to the Wayne State College Festival of Honor Band.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte, Levi Fiscus, Christian Fiscus, and Dawson Dresden were selected to the Mid-States Conference Honor Band



- 2.3 The Jazz Band performed at the NECC Jazz Festival and earned an Excellent Rating. 2.3 The Pep Band traveled to Lincoln to play at the State Basketball Tournaments
- 2.4 Discussion about adding an incentive for graduate classes has been discussed, waiting on approval from the President's office and the board.

January 1, 2025 Report

- 2.1 Anatomy students went to SDSU to view and work on cadavers. After the semester they will be going to the Wayne College of Massage Therapy.
- 2.1 Government and History classes finished election day activities. Seniors are preparing for taking the Citizenship test.
- 2.1 In the various social studies classes, students participated in the Patriot's Pen (junior high) or the Voice of Democracy (high school) contests that are sponsored by the American Legion
- 2.1 Students 7-12 are working on Poetry Out Loud poems for the upcoming competition.
- 2.1 Mr. Paltz continues to be an invaluable resource to the science department and theology department.
- 2.1 Miss Pfeifer- Freshmen English students are learning how to properly write and self-revise a formal expository essay
- 2.1 Junior English students did extensive preparation for the Fall ACT and many attested that it did pay off.
- 2.1 Teachers are finalizing the textbook rotation plan.
- 2.2 Jr. high and high school students are enrolled in Family and Consumer Science classes offered at Cedar Catholic.
- 2.2 Jr. high and high school students are enrolled in Art classes offered at Cedar Catholic.
- 2.3 Competitive speech class is offered in the regular class schedule.
- 2.3 Junior High speech season is practicing each week.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte auditioned and was accepted into Nebraska-A 11 State Band
- 2.3 High School Choir attended Northeast Community College . We sang and worked with Margaret Schultz (Northeast Director) and then we recorded our songs. The students were then treated to see how a state-of-the-art recording studio works and they were able to hear themselves.
- 2.3 Currently have several students will be auditioning for honor choir and honor bands for second semester.
- 2.4 Conducted a salary and benefit comparability study with comparisons to area public schools and Rural Catholic schools in our Archdiocese for administration and teacher salary comparisons.
- 2.4 Mr. Cattau has ongoing classroom observations and completed first semester formal evaluations on all new teachers.
- 2.4 All core and elective teachers are teaching in their endorsed areas of study.

- 2.3 Cedar Catholic High School Choir as 74 students this year in the ensemble.



- 2.3 Cedar Catholic High School choir will be traveling to Norfolk to do a recording in their new state of the art recording studio for the experience and to work with Northeast Community College music department.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic Swing choir has 26 members this year. First performances will be in January.
- 2.3 Members of the high school choir will be trying out for various collegiate honor choirs this fall.
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic Band participated in the Wayne State Band Day Competition on Saturday October 5"
- 2.3 Cedar Catholic Pep Band has been performing at football and volleyball games.
- 2.3 Donnie Schulte auditioned for the prestigious Nebraska All State Band.
- 2.3 Several Junior High Band Students will be auditioning for the 8th Grade All State Band to be taking place in November.
- 2.3 One Act rehearsals started with a record number of students on stage: This year there are 60 kids who will be on cast.
- 2.3 There are four performances scheduled for "THE ALMOST TRUE TALE OF ROBIN HOOD."

2025-2026 First Semester Highlights

- **Band**-The Cedar Catholic instrumental music program currently has 43 students grades 7-12. The marching band competed at the WSC Band Day Parade and earned 2nd place in their division. Many of the students have auditioned for and have been accepted to numerous honor bands throughout the state, including WSC, UNK, Class C All-State, and Nebraska All-State.
- **Choir**-There are 23 students in our swing choir this year. The students will compete in multiple contests in the second semester. The choir sang for two masses that were led by Archbishop McGovern, with one of those being during the OACCW conference that was held at Cedar Catholic. There are 63 students in the choir this year.
- **Volleyball**-This year's volleyball team had 23 members. They competed hard all season and were the sub-district runner-up and they also finished well in multiple tournaments throughout the season.
- **Football**-This year we had 47 young men out for football. They finished 10-1 and made it to the state quarterfinals. We had 11 different players that were named on postseason teams. They finished rated 4th in all the postseason ratings by state publications.
- **Girls Golf**-There were three girls on this year's team, and they showed great improvement throughout the season. One of the girls received medals during the season.
- **Cross Country**-This year there were five students that participated on the cross country teams. All of our students medaled at various meets throughout the season.

July 1, 2025 Report

- 3.1 All adjustments and updates continue to be sent via Flocknote.
- 3.2 Coaches continue to promote their programs and encourage students to participate in all programs provided by the school.
- 3.2 Cedar Catholic finished 4th in the multi-activity participation program. This program uses your volleyball classification to determine what class you are in (we would have won Class C).

2024-2025 1st Semester Highlights

- **Band** They have 26 members and this Fall they attended the WSC band day' and performed at the Christmas concert. They also had one member on the All-State Honor Band in Lincoln.
- **Choir** They have 75 students this year with 32 also being involved in swing choir. They performed at their Christmas concert and also did a professional recording in Norfolk and on Spirit Catholic radio.

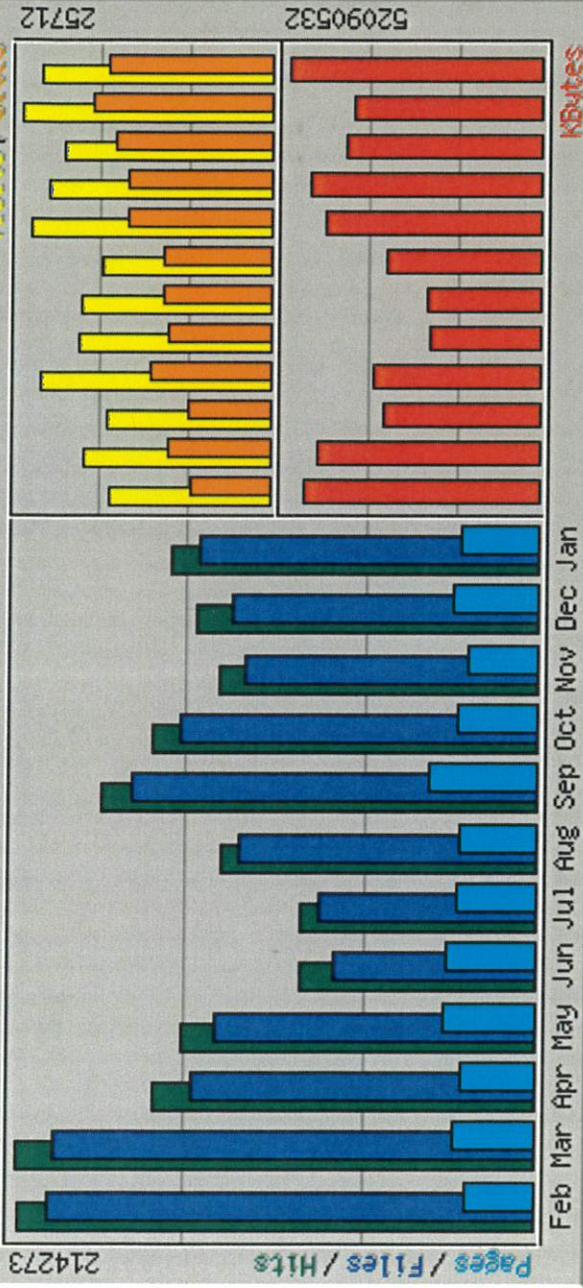
