


We leave Cedar sadly, happily; sad because it's a part of our lives that is over. But, for that same reason, we are happy. We have so many friends, so many memories.















Pep Club Expands

Awards were given to those with perfect attendance, no demerits, honor roll students, highest rank in class and achievement in academic subjects.











Cedar Initiates Techniques










Cedar Finishes Fourth In NE Nebraska





With the loss of eight fumbles, a quarterback, and a game at Columbus-Lakeview, Cedar turned around and won 6 of their last 8 games. A 6-3 record enabled them to finish fourth in Northeast Nebraska. Besides losing to Lakeview, Cedar lost to the 1st and 3rd ranked teams in Northeast Nebraska, Wayne and Wisner-Pilger.


In between these losses, Cedar rolled over Crofton, Stanton, Madison, Bloomfield, Emerson-Hubbard, and Wakefield.

Running was Cedar's main way of moving the ball. Jon Wieseler and Bill Pinkelman combined for nearly 2000 yards. Jon set a new school record for rushing at 1154 yards. Defensively, Cedar allowed a mere 100 yards a game.

5 Cedar boys made the All-Conference Team. They were Jon Wieseler, running back; Dave Schmidt, offensive tackle; Dan Hoesing, middle guard; Bill Pinkelman, defensive end; and Dan Noecker, defensive back. Making honorable mention were Galen Kathol, Al Steffen, and Jody Kathol. Jon came in second for the voting of the MVP of the West Husker Conference.

Jon Wieseler and Bill Pinkelman also made the Northeast Nebraska Top Twenty Football Team and both received honorable mention All-State.



Cedar Closes At 18-5







Cedar Catholic Trojans closed out their 1974-75 season with an 18-5 record, losing in the District finals to West Point C. C. 63-41. Cedar advanced to the finals with wins over Randolph and Wisner-Pilger. During the course of the year, Cedar participated in three other tournaments. Cedar won the Bloomfield Invitational over Hartington High 57-46. Cedar finished second in the Coleridge Invitational with a double overtime loss to the same Hartington High team 86-83. Cedar came from 10 points down with two minutes left to send the game into overtime. In the Husker Conference Tourney, Cedar was thumped by Columbus Lakeview 62-39. This loss was later revenged in the regular season finale 67-52. Before the win over Lakeview, Cedar had defeated the then 10th ranked team in the state, and conference champs, Wayne Blue Devils 57-53. This marked the third straight year that Cedar had defeated the Conference champs.

Named to the West Husker Conference team were Tom Schieffer and Dick Uhing with Paul Stevens receiving honorable mention.




Girls Set Ten Records

Carolyn and Charleen both qualified for the State Meet. As a team, Cedar placed fourth and amassed 44 points in the district meet in Wisner.






New Coach Directs Track Team
